Budaun (UP), May 6 (IANS) Uttàr Pradesh Police on Monday said an FIR has been regisdi Party leader Samajwa-di Party leader Shivpal Yadav for allegedly mak-ing derogatory state-ments against BSP chief Mayawati. Police said that on the complaint of BSP leader Ram Prakash Tyagi, an FIR was registered against Shivpal Yadav at the Civil Lines Police Station.

He said that Yadav has been booked under sections 504 (intentional insult) and 505 (statements creating public mischief) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC). Shivpal Yadav's son

Aditya Yadav is the SP candidate from Badaun, where voting will be held on Tuesday.In his complaint, Tyagi alleged that on May 3 he saw a news clipping in which Yadav used "indecent and obiectionable" language against Mayawati.

It was revealed in a survey from various Lakshadweep islands that a considerable percentage of the hard coral species have undergone severe bleaching, primarily due to a prolonged period of marine heatwaves affecting the region since late October 2023. Student protests in the **US: Campus and Camp**

Agitations across US universities could have been an occasion for a deeper conversation. That armed police and maximalist slogans have taken over marks a failure.

The detention of over 2,000 students across universities in the US and the presence of armed riot police on campuses marks a leadership failure in some of the most prestigious institutions of higher education in the world. This failure is administrative, pedagogical and more broadly, philo-sophical. It involves shifting answers to complex questions around free expression and security, "cancelling" and nuance, outrage and engage-ment. Comparisons have been made between the current protests and those in 1968. They ignore one crucial difference: In the '60s, students formed one crucial difference: In the '60s, students formed a compact with broader society in which sections of the privileged stood with the discriminated to demand racial equality, alongside questioning the Vietnam War. The current protest, till now, seems to draw a line between the larger society, politics and the campus.

The images of the ongoing, horrific brutality by Israel's defence forces in Gaza in the aftermath of the terrorist attacks by Hamas on October 7 will move most people emotionally - and in many cases, even politically. The passionate response from students is thus understandable and predictable. That said, the pro-Gaza "encamp-ments" — which began with Columbia University in New York and have since spread across the country and beyond — have also been marked by maximalist slogans and demands. America's free speech laws are almost absolute, allowing for what many would even consider hate speech. Campuses - like private workplaces - however, have their own rules regarding offence, racism, xenophobic statements and calls to violence. In situations such as the current one, university administrations have to negotiate a balance be-tween the campus as a space for expression on the one hand and order and safety on the other. They have failed so far. The most important question that arises in the wake of the turmoil is this: Why have the most international, cosmopolitan spaces, with vast intellectual resources, floundered in creating avenues for genuine debate between competing ideas?

The inability of most institutions to effectively facilitate a conversation is being seen by many as a result of a culture of their own making. The much-discussed "cancel culture" has, at least in part, eschewed nuance for moral certainty and signalled to many that taking offence can be the basis of a political grand narrative.



New Delhi, May 6 (IANS) Taking acid reflux med-ications may raise the risk of migraines in individuals already suffering from the debilitating headache, according to a top neurologist.

Dr Sudhir Kumar from Indraprastha Apollo Hospi-tals, said this, citing a recent study published in the journal Neurology Clinical Practice.

Led by researchers from the University of Maryland in the US, the study showed that acid-reducing drugs, including proton pump inhib-itors (PPIs) such as omeprazole and esomeprazole, histamine H2-recep-tor antagonists (H2RAs), H2 blockers such as cimetidine and famotidine, and antacid supplements, are linked to a higher risk of migraines and other severe headaches than people who do not take these medications.

"In people who are suffering from migraines or other severe headstopping these medicines to see if their headaches reduce," the doc-

tor wrote in a post on X. The study found that PPIs use was associated with a 70 per cent higher risk of migraines and other headaches, while H2RAs use was associated with a 40 per cent higher risk."It is possible that these observed associations are related to comorbidity between gastrointestinal (GI) conditions and migraine disease and symptoms, Dr Sudhir ex-

He noted that several studies have observed associations be-tween the presence of migraine and GI conditions, including Heli-cobacter pylori infection, irritable bowel syndrome, celiac disease, peptic ulcers, gastroparesis, and GERD."New cases of migraine have been noted after starting PPI/ H2RA therapy. Therefore, further studies are needed to establish the cause-effect relationship," Dr Sudhir said.

Bharuch District Election Administration sets up polling station in shipping container for voters of Aliabet surrounded by water

voter is of utmost importance in elections which are the grand festival of democracy. While every single vote is instrumental in shaping the future of the country and strengthening the democracy, Special arrangements have been made by the district election administration so that a total of 254 voters, including 136 male and 118 female voters of Aliya Bet, which is remote and surrounded by River and Ocean water on all sides in Wagra tehsil of Bharuch district, can easily vote in the upcoming Lok Sabha elections. In which a polling station has been built in a temporary shipping container.

A special arrangement will once again be made for the voters of Alia Bet, located at the confluence of the Arabian Sea and the Narmada Maiya, after the last assembly elections. Due to which the voters will be able to exercise the sacred right of suffrage at their doorstep. This is the reason why Election Commission of India's approach of 'every vote counts' and the importance of suffrage in a democracy are being validated by such voter-oriented measures.

The first elections in the country were held in 1951-52 and till the 2022 Gujarat Assembly elections, local self-rule and ParliamentaryAssembly elections were need dul-ing the last 70 years, Voters of Aliya Bet used to go to vote in Kaladara village, which is 82 km away by land and 15 km by water from Aliabet by boat. Often, if the water level of the river decreased, all the voters were taken in ST buses by the district administration.

Alia Bet in Wagra taluka is 17.70 km long and 4.82 km wide in the delta region of the Narmada river flowing through Bharuch district of the state and merging into the Arabian Sea. Aliabet with an area of 22,000 hectares is connected to Hansot by land, but as it is attached to the Kaladara Group Gram Panchayat, it falls under 68-Kaladara-02 of the 151-Wagra Assembly Constituency. In the Taluka Panchayat Election 2021, for the first time, 204 voters out of 230 voted.

In the last Assembly Election-2022, the Bharuch District Election Administration, under the guidance of District Collector Mr. Tushar Sumera, set up a voting booth in a specially made shipping container for the first time in Alia Bet itself so that the people of Aliya Bet can easily vote at their doorsteps. If you want to come back after voting, you have to wait for the tide to rise again at 5.00 pm or take a detour of 82 km. In the 2017 assembly elections, the Administration made special arrangement of ST buses for the voters of Aliabet and voters were taken from Aliabet to Hansot at Bharuch and Wagra.

They have more than 1200 buffaloes and 600 camels. Selling milk in Bharuch villages is their main livelihood.

Milk is deposited in the Shahera dairy and sold in Hansot taluka. Earlier, milk was transported in buckets, then cycles, bikes and tempo travelers took the milk for sale.""Waterway with Bhadbhoot is the only way for 3 to 4 months of monsoon.

Locals connect to Hansot via road which is considered very difficult for 9 months, while waterway with Bhadbhoot remain the only route in monsoons for 3 to 4 months. The Narmada River on one side and the Arabian Sea and the Gulf of Khambhat on the other side, that the land here is infertile. The Island can be reached by a rough route. S. Korea's working-age population to dip by nearly 10 mn by 2044 amid low births

Seoul, May 6 (IANS) South Korea's economically active population is anticipated to plunge by nearly 10 million by 2044 amid the country's critically low births, data showed on Monday.

According to a report from the Korean Peninsula Population Institute for the Future, the number of people aged 15 to 64, which stood at 36.57 million in 2023, is projected to decrease to 27.17 million in 2044, Yonhap news agency reported.

The report also showed the number of elementary school freshmen, which came to 4,30,000 last year, is set to nearly halve to 2.20.000 in 2033.

The number of deaths is expected to reach 7,46,000 in 2060, compared with births estimated at just 1,56,000, leading to a natural population decline of 5,90,000.

Accordingly, South Korea's total population, estimated at 51.71 million in 2023, was forecast to

"The decline in the economi-cally active population will damage consumption, leading to the col-lapse of the domestic market.

It will also increase the burden of supporting the senior population, leading to an economic slowdown and prolonged low growth,' the institute said.

South Korea has been grappling with a chronically low birth rate, with the total fertility rate, the average number of children expected to be born per woman over her lifetime, reaching a record low of 0.72 in 2023. This figure is far below the 2.1 births per woman needed to maintain a stable population without immigration.

In February 2024, only 19,362 babies were born, marking the lowest number for any February since the statistics agency began collecting data in 1981.







Three arrested for attempt to extort Rs 45 lakh from Mumbai builder

body office and lodged 25 complaints against Patil, alleging irregularities in his site.To stall construction, the three accused even lodged a police complaint against the contractor of the site. "Despite the complaints, there was no official letter or verbal communication from any department to stop construction work but still the complainant decided to speak to them to understand the problem," said an investigator adding, "During the conversation, the three demanded Rs 45 lakh to withdraw the complaints."

Meanwhile, police said they even advertised in a local newspaper claiming the site to be disputed land which created reluctance among people buy a property there.

SC dismisses plea challenging result of Bihar District Judges exam

New Delhi, May 6 (IANS) The Supreme Court on Monday dismissed a plea filed by unsuccess-ful candidates from Bihar seeking direction to set aside the final result of the District Judges examination, 2015 on the ground that the interview process was vitiated.

Pronouncing its verdict, a bench, headed by Justice Hrishikesh Roy found the selection process to be legally valid and held that the requirement to obtain minimum qualifying marks in the interview is permissible and certainly not manifestly arbitrary, irrational or violative of Article 14.

The bench, also comprising Justice Prashant Kumar Mishra, in February this year, had reserved its judgment on pleas challenging the selection of only nine candidates in the interview against a total of 99 vacancies.

The petitioners said that a total of 69 candidates were called for the interview post-written examination, and in viva voce, 60 candidates, who had performed fairly well in the written test, were given below 10 marks, out of 50, and as a result, they were declared unsuccessful. Calling for immediate interference by the apex court, the plea alleged that the selection process smacked of complete arbitrariness and violated the petitioners rights under Articles 14 and 21 of the Constitution.

School principals raise concern about pitiable academic results of classes 5, 8

By Staff Reporter Ahmedabad, After scrapping the no-deten-tion policy in schools, Ma-harashtra has again made mandatory annual exams for classes 5 and 8 from this academic year to pro-ceed to the next class. The move has led to concerns among educators who claim that more students in urban area schools, than in rural schools, have been seen to fail these exams. The information came

to light during discussions held at a two-day work-shop conducted by the state-wide association of school principals in Pune district earlier this week. Since the workshop was held soon after most schools had just declared results of classes 5 and 8 exams, principals raised their concerns about children failing these exams.

Spokesperson for Maharashtra School Principals' Association, Mahendra Ganpule, said, "Many students have not been able to pass despite

grace-marks. Teachers from urban areas say they have observed close to 5 per cent failure, whereas rural schools have a slightly lesser failure rate at 4 per cent. This indicates that these children have simply not understood even basic concepts. This could be because they were not attending school or took an absolutely casual approach to exams until now due to the nodetention policy."The SCERT had prepared question-papers for these exams. "Even as there is

no centralised compilation

of marks from these ex-

ams, because schools were asked to conduct these exams at their individual levels, several principals raised their concerns during the work-shop," said Ganpule.

Students who fail these exams will get another chance with re-examination after getting supplementary guidance in the subject they failed. If they fail again, these children will repeat the class. Until now, children would proceed to the next class until Class 8, due to no detention-policy under the Right To Education (RTE) Act.

Bangladesh calls for holding Israel accountable for war crimes

Dhaka, May 6 (IANS) Bangladeshi Foreign Minister Hasan Mahmud has called for immediate cessation of the current Palestinian-Israeli conflict, ensuring humanitarian access and holding Israel accountable for war crimes and crimes against humanity.

"We, the members of the OIC (Organization of the Islamic Conference), should be part of a multitracked international engagement to end the Gaza crisis," he said while speaking at the 15th OIC Summit Conference in Banjul, capital of The Gambia, according to a Bangladeshi foreign ministry. The minister said the OIC should continue initiating dialogue with the governments and intergovernmental bodies like the United Nations, European Union and other organisations to counter Is-Tamophobia and foster tolerance, Xinhua news

agency reported.Israel launched a large-scale offensive against Hamas in Gaza on Öctober 7, 2023, following Hamas's surprise attack on southern Israel that killed about 1,200 people. The ongoing Israeli attacks on the Gaza strip have killed more than 34,600 Palestinians and

wounded over 77,800 others, according to Gaza health authorities. The attacks also led to massive destruction of homes and infrastructure in Gaza.

As part of the latest mediation efforts. Hamas. which abducted some 250 people from Israel on October 7, was presented with a proposal for a ceasefire in exchange for the release of remaining hostages. A response is still pending.During a sixday truce in November, more than 100 hostages were released. It is unclear how many of those remaining in captivity are still alive.

Excise policy scam: Delhi court denies regular bail to BRS leader K. Kavitha New Delhi, May 6

IANS) A Delhi court on Monday denied regular bail to Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) leader K. Kavitha in connection with the money laundering cas-es being probed by CBI and ED related to the al-

Israel says 3 soldiers killed in Hamas mortar attack

Jerusalem, May 6 (IANS) At least three soldiers were killed and nine others injured in a Hamas mortar attack, the Israeli army has said.

The Israeli army in a statement on Sunday said that about ten mortars were fired from the southern Gaza Strip city of Rafah on the Kerem Shalom crossing between the Palestinian en-clave and Israel, Xinhua news agency reported.

Hamas has claimed responsibility for the attack.According to the statement, Israeli warplanes, in retaliation, struck the launcher from which the projectiles were fired and a military structure located in the area.

Death toll from Brazil floods rises to 75

Sao Paulo, May 6 (IANS) At least 75 people have died from severe storms that inundated large swaths of south Brazil's Rio Grande do Sul state since April 29, the Civil Defense agency said in its latest report.

Another 155 people have been injured with 103 still missing, while 107,600 people have been evacuated to safety in 334 of the state's 496 cities, Xinhua news agency reported, citing the figures released on Sunday.

The state, which borders Argentina and Uruguay, has been ravaged by record downpours that have devastated numerous towns and lead to unprecedented flooding in the state capital of Porto Alegre, where the Guaiba River burst its banks.According to the Civil Defense agency, some 780,000 residents have been affected by flooding, with thousands of people forced to flee their homes by boats or climb onto rooftops in hope of being rescued by helicopters.

After Hamas rocket attack, 16 killed in Israeli airstrikes in Rafah

Tel Aviv, May 6 (IANS) The Hamas health department said that 16 people were killed in an Israeli air attack on Monday.

Media has reported that nine people from one family and seven members from another family were killed in the air attack.

The airstrike was in retaliation to the barrage of rockets fired by Hamas at a ground near Kerem Shalom in Southern Israel killing three Israel Defense Forces (IDF) soldiers and injuring 11 soldiers. The injured included soldiers from the 931 Battalion and one soldier from the Shaked Battalion.

The attack, according to IDF, was staged from the Rafah region early morning. Highly placed sources in the Israel Prime Minister's Office (PMO) told IANS that the war cabinet will meet on Monday and decide on the ground invasion of Rafah. Defence Minister Yoav Gallant and Minister without portfolio, Benny Gantz will be participating in the war cabinet to be held later in the day

New Delhi, May 6 (IANS) The International Cricket Council (ICC) has said it is working closely with Men's T20 World Cup host countries - the West Indies and the USA - to ensure appropriate plans are in place amidst a terror threat to the showpiece event.

The men's T20 World Cup is scheduled to take place in the West Indies and the USA from June 1-29. Reports emerged from various sections in the Caribbean media that the World Cup hosting islands in the region received terror threats from an organisation in North Pakistan.

"ICC is working closely with the host countries to ensure appropriate plans are in place. We im-mediately spoke to the authorities as the reports authorities as the reports emerged, and the Cricket West Indies has assured everyone that a comprehensive security plan is in place to address any risk, an ICC official told IANS when asked about the terror threat to the Men's T20

World Cup. Dr Keith Rowley, the Prime Minister of Trinidad & Tobago, said to Daily Express that the security agencies are working to combat terror threats to the T20 World

"Unfortunately, the threat of terrorism in its many and varied expressions is an ever-present danger in the world of the 21st century. It is against this backdrop that all nations, like our region, when hosting large or vulnerable gatherings, make an extra effort in national security preparations and response readiness to take seriously, all threats, expressed or implied. "Given the fact that bad

actors can choose to misbehave in any way possible it makes it virtually impossible to completely seal off all opportunities. However, in order to ameliorate these dangers, we at the local and regional levels have remained alert to many threats and singularly or together have our

Financial regulator finds 'illegal' stock short selling at 5 more global banks

Seoul, May 6 (IANS) South Korea's financial regulator said on Monday that it has found suspected cases of naked stock short selling at five more global investment banks (IBs), bringing the total to nine out of the 14 largest global IBs in the country.

The additional cases come after the Financial Supervisory Service (FSS) reported in January that it has detected suspécted illegal stock short-selling activities at two global IBs, reports Yonhap news

agency. The FSS has been conducting an inspection on all 14 global IBs here since it exposed two IBs suspected of placing naked stock short-selling orders worth 55.6 billion won (\$40.3 million) in 2021-

The financial regulator, together with the Financial Services Commission, had since imposed a temporarv ban on stock short selling, currently set to expire at the end of next month.

Twitter founder Jack Dorsey auits Bluesky board, confirms company

New Delhi, May 6 (IANS) Jack Dorsey, who founded Twitter (now called X), has quit the board of Bluesky, a decentralised social media platform he also helped co-founded.

The company said in a post that it is now searching for a new board member.

"With Jack's departure, we are searching for a new board member for the Bluesky public benefit company who shares our commitment to building a social network that puts people in control of their experience," Bluesky said on its own platform.Dorsey-backed Bluesky, an alternative to Twitter/X, reached two million users in Novemer last year. The company thanked Dorsey for his help in funding and initiating the project.

"Today, Bluesky is thriving as an open source social network running on 'atproto', the decentralised protocol we have built," it informed.

The company confirmed his departure after an X user asked Dorsey if he was still on Bluesky's board, to which Dorsey responded with a "no".

The platform has so far launched features like mobile push notifications, general user lists, email verification and advanced feed and thread preferences.Last year, Bluesky raised \$8 million. In 2022, it had secured \$13 million in funding with Dorsey joining its board.

Musk invites billionaire investor Warren Buffett to invest in Tesla

New Delhi, May 6 (IANS) Elon Musk, on Monday, invited billionaire investor Warren Buffett to come and invest in Tesla, which is facing tough times amid global slowdown in EV sales. Replying to an X user who posted that Berkshire Hathaway owner should sell all his shares in Apple and buy Tesla instead, the electric car company owner responded that it is an "obvious move" for him. "He (Buffett) should take a position in Tesla. It's an obvious move," posted the X owner.Buffett's Berkshire Hathaway has a stake in Chinese EV maker BYD but not in Tesla.Last weekend, in response to a post quoting Buffett's advice about the importance of spending time with loved ones, Musk replied that he would love to spend the last day of his life with his kids. Musk had even invited Buffett to invest in Tesla early on, when the company was worth 0.1 per cent, or less than \$7 billion, from what it is today."Too bad he didn't invest in Tesla when it was 0.1 per cent of today's value, Musk posted on X recently.


